ERASMUS Internship

European medical students can obtain a scholarship to study in a European institution / hospital / university, starting from the 2nd year of study, for a period of between 3 and 12 months.

- These students benefit from 12 months of mobility, studies and/or internships, per study cycle (Bachelor's, Master's, Doctorate).
- These students must be of European supranationality exclusively.

[Exception: Switzerland, Russia and Turkey]

Conditions

There are two types of **ERASMUS** mobility: **Studies** and **Traineeship**.

ERASMUS Studies:

- These are medical students between 2nd and 6th year.
- The traineeship program is similar to that of French external students, i.e. 4 hours of practical training in the hospital in the morning and 4 hours of theoretical classes at the university in the afternoon.
- The study period is supervised by the home institution and the Institut Curie. It is recognized for obtaining the diploma in France thanks to the European Credits Transfer System (ECTS) and the study contract that the student signs before leaving.

ERASMUS Traineeship:

- These are 4th year medical students (this criterion is compulsory) who apply directly to the Institut Curie.
- The programme consists of 8 hours of practical training per day in a hospital department of the Institut Curie.

Regardless of the type of **ERASMUS** mobility, the students must not take part in any activity in the clinical or medico-technical structure and cannot carry out any medical procedure, including by delegation.

Duration of the internship

- **ERASMUS Studies:** The period of study undertaken is supervised by the home and Institut Curie.
- **ERASMUS Traineeship:** The period of mobility, study and/or internship is between 3 and 12 months, and is supervised by the home (European) institution and the Institut Curie.



Level of language

- The level of French must be sufficient for the objectives of the course.
- English is required.

Funding

- **ERASMUS Studies:** They may receive a grant from the Ministry of Education or another body in the country of origin.
- **ERASMUS Traineeship:** They can apply for a grant from an organization carrying out the project and thus obtain funding. Applications are submitted by the project's coordinating organization in accordance with the timetable published each year by the European Commission.

How to apply

- Applicants must apply to the International Relations Department of their home institution or to a third party partner organization of the **ERASMUS**+ programs.
- Candidates must complete the registration form on the Institut Curie's training website and attach the documents requested for the analysis of their application.
